1 Executive summary

Launched in 2022, ClieNFarms is an Innovation Action project funded by the European Commission to support the European Green Deal. It aims to co-develop and scale up systemic, locally relevant solutions to foster climate-neutral and climate-resilient farms across Europe.

The purpose of task 5.2 of ClieNFarms (“Developing and exploiting synergies with other European Green Deal projects and initiatives”) is to ensure the project takes a systemic approach and integrates a broad perspective of the issues connected to climate-neutral farming – such as healthy food, biodiversity, soil health, renewable energy transition, and socio-economic challenges. Reciprocally, the learnings of ClieNFarms can also enrich other projects and initiatives.

This task will ensure that the most relevant connections are established between this project and targeted initiatives, from the Green Deal call and beyond, and will ensure that the climate neutrality activities of ClieNFarms serves other projects and a broader system transformation.

This interim report describes progress on engagement, knowledge-sharing, and synergy mapping activities with European initiatives and other Green Deal projects.

This report covers the following activities:

- Preparing an outreach and engagement plan for ClieNFarms synergies
- Developing a mapping of EU programmes, initiatives, and projects addressing climate neutrality in agriculture and the wider agri-food system
- Collecting relevant mapping information into a database. This database is continuously updated, and its contents are available to the WP leads of ClieNFarms as well as to partners of selected other projects.
- Developing synergies with Green Deal projects: participating in synergy workshops hosted by the Green Deal Support Office (GDSO), developing a joint action plan, and participating in joint activities with sister projects part of the Food Working Group
- Synergies with EU projects and initiatives: organising the first Synergy mapping workshop on topics relevant to ClieNFarms to identify collaborative actions
- Organising the first synergy knowledge sharing session, with project Climate Farm Demo
- Contributing to the design of a joint annual meeting with Climate Farm Demo
- Participating in synergy workshops hosted by projects and initiatives of interest (LIFE Carbon Farming, EU Farmbook)
- Collaborating with relevant initiatives, especially the Global Research Alliance (GRA) Farm to Regional Scale Integration Network, and the Climate-KIC Deep Demonstration programme on land and agrifood system transformation in Ireland, sponsored by Ireland’s Department of Agriculture, Food, and the Marine (DAFM)
- Planning for the next Synergy Mapping workshops with ClieNFarms WP leads

2 Introduction

2.1. Purpose of the document

The purpose of this interim report is to describe ClieNFarms' progress on engagement, knowledge-sharing and synergy-mapping activities with Green Deal projects and other European initiatives.

2.2. Structure of the document

This document is structured in 4 major sections:

3 Objectives of synergy work

3.1. Outreach and engagement plan for synergy activities

The outreach and engagement approach of ClieNFarms involves several key tasks aimed at fostering collaboration and synergy within the agri-food research and innovation ecosystem.

- Scouting and Mapping:
 - Through desk research and partner interactions, ClieNFarms identifies projects aligning with its focus in the EU and globally. The emphasis is on thematic alignment and complementarity, including closed projects with relevant insights.
- Prioritizing Synergies:
 - ClieNFarms uses internal discussions and surveys, desk research, and external discussions to define priorities for synergy development, considering Farm2Fork contexts and policies.
- Connecting with Projects:
 - ClieNFarms leverages its network to connect with prioritized projects, coordinating outreach through relevant consortium members and Work Package 5 (WP5).
- Green Deal Farm2Fork Activities:
 - As a project selected through the Green Deal call LC-GD-6-1-2020, ClieNFarms collaborates with eight selected projects, aiming to identify synergy areas and develop joint action plans, detailed in section 3 of the report.
- Synergy Mapping Workshops:
 - CKIC conducts workshops with a sensemaking methodology to identify priority areas for joint actions, focusing on accelerating the agrifood sector transition in line with the Farm-to-Fork (F2F) strategy.
- Knowledge Sharing Sessions:
 - CKIC organizes sessions to facilitate knowledge sharing between initiatives, producing insight briefs for dissemination. Plans for implementing joint actions are developed based on these insights.
- Communicating Synergy Opportunities:

- WP5, in collaboration with WP7 (*Coordination and project management*), communicates synergy opportunities to ClieNFarms consortium members through internal channels, newsletters, and meetings. Coordination for joint action planning and delivery is facilitated with WP7 support.
- Promoting Synergies:
 - WP5 and WP6 (*Communication, Dissemination, Training and Exploitation*) collaborate to disseminate information to and from other initiatives, identifying learnings for sharing. Public insight reports resulting from workshops are coordinated for dissemination, and external events are monitored by WP6 for synergy development.
- Large-Scale Dissemination Conference:
 - Depending on interest, a joint conference at the project's end will be organized to disseminate F2F project outcomes to stakeholders and policymakers. ClieNFarms will explore interest for such a conference in 2024/early 2025.

In summary, ClieNFarms adopts a systematic approach to engage with relevant projects, foster synergies, and share knowledge, ultimately contributing to the success of the Farm-to-Fork strategy.

4 Synergies with Green Deal Sister projects

ClieNFarms is part of a group of Horizon 2020 projects that were selected by the Green Deal call LC-GD-6-1-2020.

4.1. Green Deal synergies

To support the realisation of the European Green Deal, the European Commission has funded 73 research and innovation projects to accelerate a just and sustainable transition to a climate-neutral Europe by 2050. The Green Deal Projects Support Office (GDSO) was established to support the projects funded under the Green Deal Call and to help facilitate collaboration, share best practices, and increase their impact.

In 2022-2023, ClieNFarms participated in a series of workshops hosted by the GDSO to identify common challenges for delivery and impact across Green Deal projects, using Mentimeter and mapping tools. The GDSO also organized meeting with EU DGs, allowing ClieNFarms to contribute to exchanges on policy developments and strategic goals.

With support from the Green Deal Support Office, the Green Deal projects have been organized into thematic working groups. ClieNFarms is part of the Food and Health Working Group, and works more closely with the Food sub-group, comprised of 8 other projects.

Joint activities have been organized both at the overarching level and at the level of the thematic working groups.

4.2. Food and Health Working Group

The Food and Health working group comprises 15 projects (see figure below) from four different Green Deal Calls. The working group projects focus on reshaping the food and health sectors to better support the green transition.

4.2.2. Joint activities 2022-2023

With support from the GDSO, a joint action plan and joint activity dashboard have been developed. The first version of the action plan, drafted at the end of 2022, described activities for 2023. The action plan has been revised at the end of 2023 to prepare for 2024 activities.

4.2.2.1. Synergy mapping activities

In 2022 and 2023, ClieNFarms contributed to the following synergy mapping activities with the Green Deal Food Working Group:

- Mapping of relevant events for joint participation
- Identification of levers and barriers to impact
- Stakeholder mapping
- Policy mapping

Based on these mapping exercises, ClieNFarms participated in several activities with sister projects including:

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- Making the Agri Food Sector Circular - Circular Week 2022 Webinar
- Joint policy statement on Food Waste Reduction
- Food 2030 Conference and report

Green Deal Food Sister projects participated jointly in the Food 2030 conference organized by the EU Commission to present innovation approaches in the agrifood system. ClieNFarms was also mentioned as a relevant project in the Food 2030 report¹ published following the conference.

ClieNFarms also contributed a success story (based on the Ireland Dairy I3S Creative arena workshop) for Green Deal communication.

4.2.3. Next steps for 2024

For 2024, ClieNFarms volunteered to lead two joint activities with Green Deal Food Sister projects: joint social media campaigning activities, and knowledge and data sharing.

Knowledge and data sharing activities - Aim of the Action

This action aims to organise discussion sessions to share views and information among the Food WG projects. These sessions may trigger agreements on shared activities such as joint scientific work, presentations, side events participation, etc. The following outputs and activities are expected to take place under this action:

Output(s):

- Short presentations (if relevant/applicable)
- Discussion notes/summary of key points
- Joint research paper/articles
- Activities and Timeline
- Share experiences on methodologies, assessments, and definitions, among others.
- Discuss specific topics (e.g., innovations on the farm, food waste valorisation, etc.), where projects would join voluntarily and ask specific living labs/technical experts to discuss concrete challenges and ways to overcome them.
- Exchange views on innovation/regional upscaling, downscaling, and replication.
- Discuss technology/innovation and scale/transfer related to food.
- Share ideas for citizen/stakeholder involvement.
- Creating a common script for reaching climate neutrality, common capacity-building and education programmes taking into account all the outputs of the different projects.

5 Synergies with other EU projects and initiatives

5.1. Identification of relevant projects and initiatives

5.1.1. Synergy database

Data related to the relevant projects and initiatives for ClieNFarms are collected in a database hosted on the Airtable platform (airtable.com), shared with the ClieNFarms consortium exclusively. 150 projects

ClieNFarms is currently developing maps based on the synergy database with the Kumu tool (kumu.io), to provide more visualisation of project links. Here is an example of visualisation:

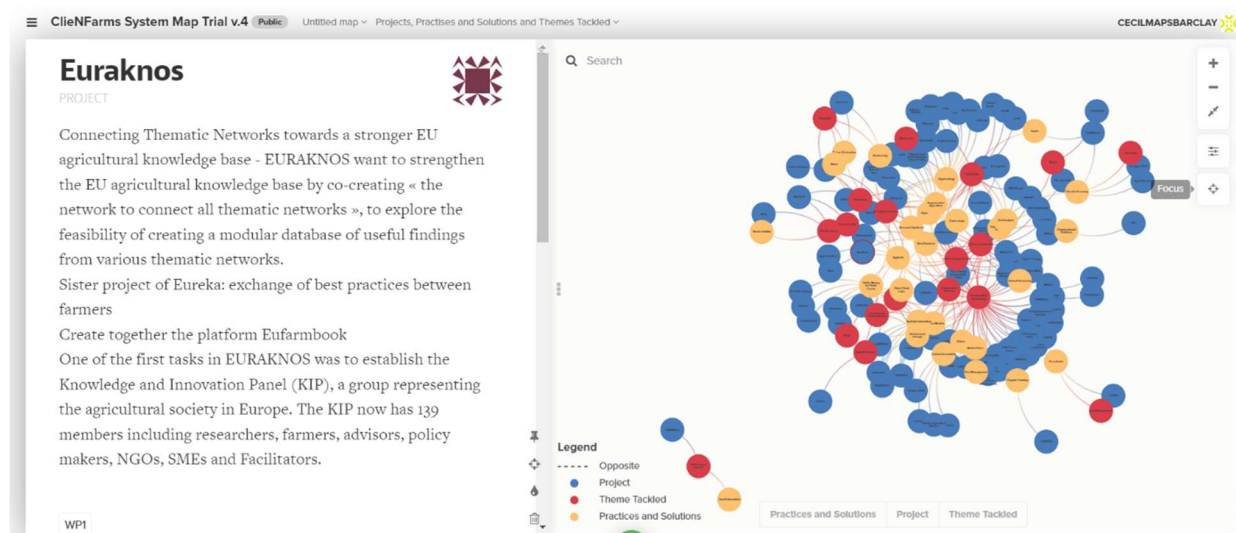


Figure 4: Screen capture from ClieNFarms Kumu.io map

5.1.2. Identification of priority synergy topics

In 2022, a first list of priority topics for synergies and knowledge exchange was developed via a ClieNFarms consortium survey.

This list was then updated at the first ClieNFarms annual meeting (October 2022), via a participative session.

The topics identified as priorities for synergy development were the following:

- Carbon Farming and Carbon removal certification
- Farm networking and peer-to-peer learning
- Communication, Dissemination and Knowledge sharing
- Adaptation and Resilience for farming
- Landscape approaches
- New governance and business models for climate-neutral farming
- Systemic scaling
- Data collection

5.2. Joint activities

5.2.1. 1st synergy mapping workshop: Climate neutrality from Farm to Fork: What synergies between projects in the EU and beyond?

Based on the synergy database and on the list of identified topics, the ClieNFarms team developed a plan for a workshop series spanning the 4-year duration of the project. The first workshop, held online on October 12, 2022, was designed as an introductory session, with a broad thematic scope and 10 short presentations from diverse projects tackling climate neutrality challenges in the food value chain.

From carbon sequestration, GHG emission reduction, waste reduction and circular economy, to adaptation and resilience, there are many ways of tackling climate challenges in the agrifood system. The purpose of this workshop was to look at different parts of the system, to exchange on the potential and

complementarity of different solutions, and to map synergies across participating projects. Together, participants identified potential areas and topics for joint actions or joint learning.

List of participating projects:

- Horizon 2020 projects: AgroBridges, AgroFossilFree, i2connect
- Horizon 2020 Green Deal Sister projects: ENOUGH, ZeroW
- FACCE ERA-GAS projects: Integrity, ReLive
- National Initiatives, focus on Ireland: Farm Zero C, Ireland Deep Demonstration (EIT Climate-KIC)

The workshop was designed according to the sensemaking methodology developed by EIT Climate-KIC, following three phases:

- Storytelling/project presentations in a “pitch” format (3 minutes) followed by 3 minutes of Q&A with the audience
- Review of harvested material: two harvesters present the mapping they produced while listening to the storytelling
- Insight generation/synergy mapping: collective discussion and synergy mapping for joint actions and joint learnings, using virtual post-it notes

The conversation focused mainly on the following topics:

- Projects can learn together about how to scale up impact and transformation in the agri-food value chains.
- Sharing learnings across projects (about solutions, practices, approaches – what works and what doesn’t) is crucial.
- There is a lot of potential for data sharing across projects, but this comes with challenges (e.g. regarding GDPR rules).
- Knowledge management is a key issue. Creating a process and templates for learnings and solutions sharing across projects feels necessary. This includes identifying the right platform and media for sharing knowledge and data without overwhelming stakeholders. Both the digital and human resources components are important to reach the relevant audience.

5.2.2. Bilateral activities

5.2.2.1. *Climate Farm Demo*

Climate Farm Demo is a unique pan-European network of Pilot Demo Farmers (PDFs) covering 28 countries and all pedo-climatic areas. Its overall aim is to accelerate the adoption of Climate Smart Farming (CSF) practices and solutions by farmers and all actors of the Climate Smart Agriculture Knowledge & Innovation Systems (AKIS) with a view to adapting agricultural production systems to climate change and to achieving a carbon neutral agricultural sector by 2050, thereby meeting the targets of the EU Climate strategy. Climate Farm Demo is a Horizon Europe Coordination and Support Action (CSA).

ClieNFarms and Climate Farm Demo have identified substantial alignment and complementarities in terms of delivery ambition. Both aim to support agricultural transition in Europe and to contribute to the EU’s strategic goals to reduce the climate and environmental impact of agrifood systems. Due to their respective IA and CSA nature, the two projects have different approaches to action, which can offer interesting complementarities. It also makes sense for the two projects to work together due to their geographical overlaps.

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After a synergy mapping and knowledge exchange session held in January 2023, the two projects decided to organize a joint annual meeting in Cork, Ireland, in October 2023. Teagasc, an Executive committee member in both projects, hosted the joint meeting and organized joint demonstration farms visits. The meeting agenda comprised both parallel and joint sessions, allowing the development of stronger connections, and the identification of further opportunities for collaboration. Climate Smart Advisors, Climate Farm Demo's sister project, was also represented in the meeting.

The meeting included joint project presentation sessions, a joint session on demonstration methodology, a joint session on transition risks management, and a joint session on climate impact monitoring tools and rewarding mechanisms.

The synergies identified are the following (some are already effective, while others are in development):

Already active:

- Alignment on climate smart/climate neutral farming solution catalogue
- Alignment on demonstration methodology
- Knowledge exchange on I3S/Living Lab approaches
- Knowledge exchange on risks and opportunities linked to the transition to climate neutral farming
- Alignment on MRV tools and methodologies to support carbon farming

To be further developed:

- Potential alignment on scaling approaches, business models, and rewarding mechanisms
- Joint communication campaigns
- Joint capacity building activities

5.2.2.2. Other Horizon 2020 and Horizon Europe projects – EJP Soil, EU Farmbook, BEATLES, CREDIBLE, ORCASA

ClieNFarms is developing close links with the EJP Soil programme via its partner network. Collaboration activities developed in 2023 were the following:

- Joint demonstration event in Belgian I3S, visit of the *Systèmes de cultures Innovants* (SyCI) platform²
- Road4Schemes project: Knowledge exchange on carbon standard approaches for scaling carbon farming practices

Via bilateral meetings, participation in projects kick-off meetings, and contribution to workshops, ClieNFarms also developed links with the following projects:

- EU Farmbook – *Digital Platform gathering and sharing agriculture and forestry knowledge*
 - o Knowledge exchange on climate-neutral farming solutions dissemination
- BEATLES – *Behavioural Change Towards Climate-Smart Agriculture*
 - o Knowledge exchange on scaling approaches for climate-neutral farming
- CREDIBLE – *Credible EU Carbon Farming*
 - o Knowledge exchange on carbon farming practices, methodologies, and challenges
- ORCASA – *Operationalising International Research Cooperation on Soil carbon*
 - o Knowledge exchange on climate-neutral farming solutions

5.2.2.3. LIFE Carbon Farming

The LIFE Carbon Farming project's objective is to reduce by 15% the carbon footprint of mixed farming-livestock farms through a result-based remuneration system. ClieNFarms was participated in the project's

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kick-off meeting on January 25 2023, and facilitated a joint session on MRV approaches for Carbon Farming. Together with the Climate Farm Demo project, ClieNFarms and LIFE Carbon Farming have met several times to explore potential synergies on Carbon Farming, MRV, and scaling approaches.

5.2.2.4. *EU Expert Group on Carbon Removals*

ClieNFarms partners have taken an active role in policy and technical discussions about the future EU Framework for Carbon removals. ClieNFarms organized an informal policy workshop on this topic in January 2023, responded to the commission's public consultation, and follows closely the work of the EU Expert Group on Carbon Removals in which several consortium members are engaged as experts or observers.

5.2.2.5. *Global Research Alliance – Farm to Regional Scale integration network*

The Farm to Regional Scale integration network is a group of researchers working on developing and applying generic and robust methods for assessing the feasibility and the economics of measures to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from agriculture. Respective concepts are used at the farm level and upscaled to regional scale. ClieNFarms and the GRA network have met several times to share knowledge on scaling approaches for climate-neutral farming. ClieNFarms and the GRA network gave keynotes presentations together in a Panel organized by the GRA on Economics of Climate Change Mitigation Strategies at Farm Level at the XVII Congress of the European Association of Agricultural Economists (EAAE) "Agri-food systems in a changing world: Connecting science and society" in August 2023. A ClieNFarms intervention is planned in the GRA session "Opportunities and challenges for farm-level GHG accounting" at the conference "Agricultural research in times of climate change" which takes place from 11th to 14th March 2024 in Potsdam, Germany. ClieNFarms will also be invited to the next GRA network annual meeting to present learnings.

5.2.2.6. *SAI platform*

SAI Platform is an organisation created by the food industry to communicate and to actively support the development of sustainable agriculture involving stakeholders of the food chain. The SAI platform contributes to ClieNFarms's work on the carbon credit allowance platform prototype, as part of Work Package 4, by sharing their perspective as industry stakeholder representatives.

5.2.2.7. *Ireland Deep Demonstration*

The Irish Department of Agriculture, Food, and the Marine (DAFM) has partnered with EIT Climate-KIC, a ClieNFarms partner, to work with public and private stakeholders in the Irish land and agri-food system to help accelerate its pathways to climate neutrality.

EIT Climate-KIC is applying its 'Deep Demonstration' model of innovation to the Irish agri-food and bio-based value chain, from soil to farm to fork to society. This involves working with stakeholders from both public and private sectors, including finance and education, as well as civil society, to develop and deploy coordinated innovation actions that work – in practice and at scale – and to obtain insights and lessons about a range ('portfolio') of solutions.

ClieNFarms and Deep Demonstration partners have met to share learnings on climate-neutral farming solutions and scaling challenges, and continue exchanging knowledge on policy and technical innovation. Deep Demonstration partners participated to the ClieNFarms Ireland I3S creative arena workshop in January 2023.

In 2023, together with DAFM and the Environmental Defence Fund (EDF Europe), EIT Climate-KIC has launched a series of flagship programmes to tackle identified agri-food challenges. ClieNFarms will

contribute to the Sustainable Beef, Sustainable Dairy, and Carbon Farming flagships by sharing learnings from methodology development, from solution application in the field, and by sharing relevant elements from the ClieNFarms scaling toolbox. ClieNFarms and the Deep Demonstration programme aim to work together on developing systemic scaling approaches for sustainable farming.

6 Next steps

The synergy action plan will be updated at the beginning of 2024 with the ClieNFarms Executive Committee. The list of potential synergy workshops and knowledge exchange webinar topics will be reviewed and updated. Already identified priority topics include: climate-neutrality in agriculture; scaling approaches; new business models; landscape approaches; renewable energy in farming; resilient farming practices.

7 Conclusions

This interim report provides an overview of ClieNFarms' efforts towards fostering collaboration and knowledge-sharing within the agrifood research and innovation landscape, particularly in alignment with the Farm-to-Fork strategy.

The mutualization of effort and resources across European projects and initiatives is essential to ensure meaningful contributions to a climate-neutral Europe by 2050. Via joint activities, bilateral engagements, and knowledge-sharing sessions, the ClieNFarms project is already building meaningful partnerships to enhance collective impact and systemic action. These efforts extend not only to European projects but also to global collaborations, as seen in the interactions with the Global Research Alliance – Farm to Regional Scale integration network.

Many synergy activities are already envisioned by ClieNFarms for 2024 and 2025, including joint social media campaigns, knowledge, and data sharing initiatives with Green Deal Sister projects, as well as the ongoing development of synergy workshops and knowledge sharing webinars. The commitment to addressing priority topics such as climate-neutral farming, scaling approaches, new business models, and resilient farming practices reflects the project's strategic vision for the future.

ClieNFarms has taken significant strides in creating a collaborative ecosystem, where diverse projects and initiatives converge to accelerate the transition towards sustainable and climate-neutral agrifood systems. ClieNFarms will continue the work to position this ecosystem as a pivotal player in the realization of the Farm-to-Fork strategy, contributing to a more resilient, efficient, and environmentally conscious future for the European agrifood sector.
